Re: Standards

As a distinctively Christian institution, Calvary Baptist Bible College sets personal standards designed to aid students in development of those character attributes which best enhance their personal Christian testimony. Emphasis at Calvary is centered on the spiritual quality of life of our students, and designed to encourage a love for the Lord Jesus Christ, as demonstrated through a separated, consecrated Christian life.

Students at CBBC may not participate in activities such as dancing, gambling, or movie-going, and includes the viewing of videos or television programs which detract from Christian growth. Of course, the use of alcoholic beverages, drugs, tobacco, obscenity or griping in any form is not tolerated.

Acceptance at CBBC is for a four year college degree program, and students must attend, and are encouraged to serve in the numerous ministry opportunities available at Calvary Baptist Tabernacle. Therefore, all students will unite in membership with Calvary Baptist Tabernacle at the first service after arrival at the school.

Men must maintain a conservative haircut, with hair off the ears, collar, and eyebrows. Beards and mustaches must be neat and trimmed at all times. Coats, ties, and dress shoes are to be worn to all Sunday morning services, and for responsibilities during any service (ushers, prayer, special music, choir, etc). A dress shirt, tie, and dress shoes are required for all other services. Jeans or sandals are never appropriate for any Church service.

Women students must wear dresses or skirts which come to the bottom of the knee, and are modest from a standpoint of both exposure and accent. Slacks or shorts are not permitted, although full-style culottes to the bottom of the knee may be worn for casual activities. Is it long enough, is it high enough, is it thick enough, and is it loose enough is the Pastor's expressed standard for our ladies.

It is necessary to maintain a definitive position in opposition to any theological movement which deviates from the truth of the Word of God. Without meaning to be unfriendly or unkind to anyone, CBBC maintains that the charismatic movement, neo-evangelicalism, neo-orthodoxy, and those associated with these movements, and the numerous offshoots of these movements, are incongruous with the verity of Holy Writ. Persons who apply from such a background would probably not qualify for admission, unless their desire is to shun their spiritually profligate training and obtain a truly independent, fundamental Baptist education predicated upon the English King James Version of the Bible.
